

About Choral Evensong

Evensong is the distinctively Anglican service that is said or sung daily in cathedrals and churches throughout the world. Its origins lie in the pattern of monastic worship, which dates to the earliest form of Christian worship. Archbishop Thomas Cranmer (1489-1556) merged the two monastic services of Vespers and Compline to create the form of the service we are using tonight. It has been largely unchanged since the introduction of the English Prayer Book of 1549.

In the worship that is Choral Evensong, the choir and musicians serve as the worship leaders. Key parts of the service include a sung Psalm, the Song of Mary, the Song of Simeon, and one or more anthems. Evensong is also different from our other forms of worship, in that it requires worshiping by listening, while the choir offers its prayers and gifts on behalf of the congregation through the music and texts.

This musical setting of the Daily Evening Office is a fitting time to give thanks for the ministry of Canon Ken Brown, who has devoted himself to helping the Cathedral sing praises to God for twenty years. Ken Brown, Canon for Music and Worship, was named Minister of Music in 1996 after working for two years as assistant to Brian Rowe. He originally came to the Cathedral in 1988 as Interim Organist, and began singing with the choir in 1992. We are blessed by his dedication, creativity, sense of humor and incredible gifts as an organist. To help celebrate Trinity Sunday and Ken Brown's 20th anniversary, the choir will debut an anthem commissioned by composer Daniel Gawthrop. Daniel Gawthrop, an old friend of Ken's, is an American composer, primarily of choral music. His output also includes a substantial body of works for the organ as well as orchestral and instrumental works. He has been the recipient of over one hundred commissions to write original music.
